A Strategy for Addressing Homelessness

The All In Sacramento plan builds upon the 2022 Local Homeless Action Plan that created a regional partnership, established strategies, set benchmarks, and met state funding requirements. This next phase features eight core solutions that represent more targeted components of an effective and coordinated system. Key actions in each of these areas will help the Sacramento community achieve its vision of making homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring.





Coordinated Access & Navigation

Centralized access to homeless and rehousing services across a variety of physical and virtual access points





Rehousing Assistance

Coordinate existing and new rehousing resources to rapidly move clients to permanent housing





Diversion & Prevention Assistance

Prevent at-risk households from falling into homelessness and/or divert from entry into the homeless response system





Permanent Supportive Housing

Expand housing opportunities and capacity dedicated to meet the housing needs of persons experiencing homelessness





Outreach & Engagement

Align outreach efforts across jurisdictions and facilitate permanent housing placements from unsheltered locations





Integrated Services

Expand partnerships with other systems that serve clients experiencing homelessness, including behavioral health, jails, hospitals, and others



Emergency Shelter & Interim Housing

Continue support for flexible emergency shelter and interim housing that focuses on moving clients to permanent housing





System Capacity Building & Training

Continue to develop and train a diverse workforce to deliver homelessness services across the response system



An updated strategic plan outlining a county-wide approach to ending homelessness that is:







Transforming our system by:

- · Investing in and coordinating efforts to prevent homelessness,
- Fundamentally reorienting our system's focus on Rehousing, and
- · Ensuring consistent and equitable access to quality personcentered care.

In order to:

- Reduce the number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness by 20%,
- Increase the percentage of people exiting to permanent housing to at least 42%





So that we can realize our vision:

· A person-centered, trauma-informed regional response system where homelessness is rare, brief, and nonrecurring.



Key Strategies

- Continue to improve the countywide Coordinated Access System by building capacity to the 2-1-1 (#8) Housing Crisis Line and by adding physical access
- > Establish a Coordinated Prevention Core Team for the region, with a priority on involving people with lived experience.
- > Establish a multi-year plan to increase the community's ability to rapidly rehouse persons experiencing homelessness
- Improve access to resources across systems including, for instance, behavioral health, hospitals, jails, public benefits, and employment
- Implement a pilot program to identify the most frequently served individuals across systems and provide individualized support
